BIM LEVEL 2 POLICY STATEMENT

Policy

Collaboration within the projects that we undertake is key to their success. It will help us to achieve a higher standard of quality and a greater efficiency of project delivery through the reuse and sharing of knowledge and experience.

Suttles believe that if the implementation of high standards is adequately addressed, there will be significant benefits to the productivity of project teams and the profitability of the organisation.



Building Information Modelling (BIM) as described in ISO 19650 will have clear and dramatic benefits to all stakeholders involved in the construction industry once it has been implemented. Our aims -
